Information for Bidders

Bidding

The following means are available for placing bids:

- 1) Attending the Live Auction in Person: All bidders must register for a paddle, and new bidders must provide references at least three business days in advance of the sale.
- **2) Live Internet Bidding:** Instructions for participating as a Live Internet Bidder are provided on the page opposite.
- **3) Phone Bidding:** Bidders can be connected to the sale by phone and bid through a member of staff. Requests for phone bidding are subject to approval (please contact our office at least 24 hours before the sale). A signed Bid Form is required.
- 4) Absentee Bids. All bids received in advance of the sale, either by mail, fax, phone, e-mail or internet, are Absentee Bids, which instruct the auctioneer to bid up to a specific amount on one or more lots in the sale. Absentee Bids sent by phone, fax or e-mail should arrive at least one hour prior to the start of the sale session. Bids entered through Live Internet Bidding will be visible to the auctioneer during the sale. Written bids should be entered legibly on the Bid Form in the sale catalogue. E-mail and internet bids should be carefully typed and double-checked. All new bidders must provide references. We recommend calling or e-mailing to confirm that Absentee Bids sent by mail, fax or e-mail have been received and entered.

Pre-Sale Viewing

Subject to availability, certain lots (except group lots) can be sent to known clients for examination. Requests must be made no later than 7 days prior to the sale. Lots must be returned on the day received. Postage/insurance costs will be invoiced.

In addition to regular viewing, clients may view lots by appointment. Our staff will be pleased to answer questions or provide additional information about lots.

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Individual items offered without a PF or PSE certificate dated within the past five years may be purchased subject to independent certification of genuineness and our description. Please refer to the Conditions of Sale and Grading Terms for policies governing certification.

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Prices realized are sent with each invoice. Bidders with e-mail will receive a Bid Results report after the sale. Session results are posted immediately to **siegelauctions.com**

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

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Conditions of Sale (please read carefully before bidding)

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 15% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax, use tax or customs duties due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
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- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within 3 days from the date of sale. The Galleries retains the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash

- for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder. **Credit cards are not accepted as payment.**
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within 7 days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than 30 days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot accompanied by a certificate issued by The Philatelic Foundation or by Professional Stamp Experts within 5 years of the sale date is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that does not have a P.F. or P.S.E. certificate (dated as above) may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$600.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs. Buyers outside the U.S. are responsible for all customs duties.
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. Grades, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Grades and Centering

Our descriptions contain detailed information and observations about each item's condition. We have also assigned grades to stamps and covers, which reflect our subjective assessment. For stamps, the margin width, centering and gum are described and graded according to generally-accepted standards (an approximate correlation to numeric grades is provided at right). Although we believe our grades are accurate, they are not always exactly aligned with third-party grading terms or standards for all issues. A lot may not be returned because a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description. Information from the P.S.E. Stamp Market Quarterly and P.S.E. Population Report^{5M} is the most current available, but lots may not be returned due to errors or changes in statistics or data.

Extremely Fine Gem (90-100): The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue. This term is equivalent to "Superb" used by grading services.

Extremely Fine (80-90): Exceptionally large/wide margins or near perfect centering.

Very Fine (70-85): Normal-size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side. "Very Fine and choice" applies to stamps that have desirable traits such as rich color, sharp impression, freshness or clarity of cancel.

Fine (60-70): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (below 60): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available Scott Catalogue values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: Stanley Gibbons (SG), Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue (AAMC), Michel, Zumstein, Facit, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the *Scott Catalogue*—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.


History of Alexandria and Its Postmaster

Alexandria postmaster Daniel Bryan was born in Virginia around 1789 (reports vary) and died on December 22, 1866. Bryan served briefly in the Virginia Senate and was subsequently appointed postmaster by President James Monroe, commencing his term on April 1, 1821. He served as Alexandria's postmaster for 33 years under seven administrations and nine presidents. Bryan was re-appointed in 1853, but resigned his position in April to become Librarian of the Treasury Department.


The major Potomac River port city of Alexandria was originally part of Virginia, but became part of the District of Columbia in 1791. During the period when Postmaster Bryan's provisional stamps were in use, Alexandria was ceded back to Virginia. Retrocession took effect in three steps between July 1846 and March 1847. The first step occurred when the legislative campaign by retrocession advocates resulted in a favorable vote by the U.S. Congress on July 9, 1846. According to Post Office Department records, Alexandria technically became a Virginia post office on



On September 1 and 2, 1846, retrocession was voted upon by the white male citizens of Alexandria County (insane persons and paupers

excluded), and they voted 763 to 222 in favor. On September 7, 1846, President James K. Polk proclaimed the retrocession in full force and effect. However, it was not until March 13, 1847, that the Virginia General Assembly formally accepted the territory of Alexandria (http://alexandriava.gov and May Day Taylor, "The Alexandria Blue Boy," The American Philatelist, May 2006). Examples of the Alexandria provisional are dated from May 1846 to November 1847, during the three-step process of Alexandria's retrocession from the District of Columbia to Virginia.

A noteworthy aspect of this Alexandria cover is the letter, which refers to the September vote on the question of Alexandria's status. It reads (in part): "What do the folks in Frederick County say about retrocession? There is a good deal of talk about it here. The commissioners have appointed the first and second days of next month to take the vote... a stranger to whom she had been introduced told her he hoped she would persuade the Alexandrians to go back to Virginia. I think the country people will mostly vote against it and the town people mostly for it."


The Alexandria Provisional Stamps

The Alexandria provisional stamps were printed from a two-subject typeset form on Buff and Blue papers. The two settings differ slightly and are catalogued as two types: Type I has 40 ornaments (called rosettes or stars) arranged in a circle, and Type II has 39 ornaments. Type I (40 rosettes) shows gaps between the asterisks and the two letter A's at the beginning and end of "Alexandria." Type II (39 rosettes) does not have these gaps. The six recorded stamps printed on Buff paper are evenly divided into Type I (Scott 1X1) and Type II (Scott 1X1a). Only one example on Blue paper has been recorded — the famous Alexandria "Blue Boy" provisional on cover — and it is Type I (40 rosettes).

The identity of the Alexandria stamps' printer has not been documented, but is presumed to be Edgar Snowden (1810-1875), publisher of *The Alexandria Gazette*, whose office at 310 Prince Street was just a short distance from Bryan's post office at 400 Prince Street. The *Gazette* was founded by his father, Samuel Snowden, a native of New Jersey who moved to Alexandria in 1800. Samuel published the paper until his

death in 1831, when his sons took over, but Edgar eventually assumed control. Trained as a lawyer, Edgar was a Whig and an advocate for an industrialized South. In 1836, while still editor of the newspaper, he was elected to the City Council. He was elected mayor of Alexandria on March 6, 1840, and served until 1843. Edgar used the family newspaper to advocate many causes, especially retrocession of Alexandria back to Virginia in 1846. After retrocession Edgar was elected as a Whig to represent the city in the Virginia House of Delegates (Michael Lee Pope, October 17, 2005, at http://www.connectionnewspapers.com).

Sale History of the Alexandria "Leadbeater Copy"

According to J. Murray Bartels (Collectors Club Philatelist, July 1926), the Alexandria provisional cover offered here was discovered in April 1926 when Edward S. Leadbeater, proprietor of the Stabler-Leadbeater apothecary, "ran across three old letters addressed to his father of same name, while visiting relatives at Parkins' Mills near Winchester, Va..." According to Bartels, there were three letters from Alexandria dated within a few days of each other, but only one — this letter dated August 25, 1846 — still had an Alexandria provisional stamp affixed. Bartels reported, "It was evident that one of the other letters has also at one time borne a similar stamp but had been removed or dropped off and lost. This showed remnants of a similar wafer but the third letter had been mailed in the ordinary manner without a stamp."

The Stabler-Leadbeater pharmacy was one of the region's largest during the 19th century. According to internet sources, "It was founded by Edward Stabler, who came to Alexandria after apprenticing in the apothecary business with his brother in Leesburg, Virginia. A devout Quaker and savvy businessman,

he rented space in 1792 at the corner of King and S. Fairfax to start his business and by 1796, he began renting 107 S. Fairfax. Nine years later, he took ownership of the building and turned it into a bustling apothecary business. By 1829, he had purchased 105 S. Fairfax and incorporated the building into his operation.

"Edward Stabler sold to a variety of city and country residents — from Martha Washington to Robert E. Lee, the local doctor to the local farmer. The typical products Stabler sold included medicine, farm and garden equipment, surgical instruments, dental equipment, soap, perfume, Buffalo and Bedford mineral water, cigars, window glass, paint and varnish, artists' supplies, combs and brushes. Much of the medicine he sold was created on-site, using plant and herb materials.

"By 1806, Stabler began traveling extensively to Quaker church meetings throughout the region, leaving oldest son William to run the business in his absence. After his father's death in 1831, the business passed to William. Keeping with the family-run tradition, William brought several of his brothers and also his brother-in-law, John Leadbeater, into the business between 1832 and his death in 1852. John Leadbeater, a trained

apothecary and dentist, purchased the business from William's wife, as the couple had no children, and changed the name of the business from William Stabler and Co. to John Leadbeater.

"By the turn of the century however, the family business was beginning to feel the effects of the growing commercial pharmacies and synthetic drug companies, as well as the downturn in the economy, and the business declared bankruptcy in 1933, just days before the death of its owner, Edward S. Leadbeater, Jr."

The addressee, Edward S. Leadbeater, received this letter at the home of Nathan Parkins. From 1836 to 1874, the Parkins family operated multiple flour mills on Abram's Creek in Virginia. The mills were located south of Winchester under the name "The Union Mills, Nathan Parkins & Co. Owners." Edward S. Leadbeater Jr., the son of the addressee, sold this

Edward S. Leadbeater Jr., the son of the addressee, sold this Alexandria provisional cover to Perry W. Fuller, a Baltimore stamp dealer, for \$7,000 at a time when the family's pharmaceutical business was in decline. It was presumably bought for or sold immediately to Henry G. Lapham, because Lapham displayed a "used copy [of the Alexandria] on cover [Type I]" at the Collectors Club of New York on April 4, 1928, in his display of United States Postmasters' Provisionals. Henry Lapham later transferred ownership of his collection to his son, Raymond W. Lapham, who was the exhibition (TIPEX) in New York City. Lapham's five frames of Postmasters' Provisionals, including both of his Alexandria provisionals, won the Grand Award at TIPEX, the first time a United States collection won an international grand award.

Sometime after Henry G. Lapham died on December 13, 1939, Warren H. Colson started selling items from the Lapham collection. It is likely that Colson sold the Alexandria cover to Consul Klep (N. Klep Van Velthoven) of Belgium. When the Klep collection was sold at auction by Willy Balasse on March 27, 1956, the Leadbeater cover was lot 86 and sold to Harry Keffer for \$5,250, who outbid Raymond H. Weill (both of whom attended the sale in Brussels). Shortly after the Klep sale the Weills apparently acquired the Leadbeater cover, either for themselves or on behalf of a client, because they displayed it at the 1960 London International Stamp Exhibition.

The cover next appeared in the Siegel November 19, 1964, sale of United States Postmasters' Provisionals formed by a "Texas Collector." The unnamed collector was Thomas Cullen Davis, heir to a Texas oil fortune, who formed his collection relatively quickly while still in his late 20's and early 30's.

Davis gained notoriety in the 1970's when he was acquitted for the murder of his estranged wife's boyfriend and her daughter, and acquitted a second time for hiring a hitman to kill his wife and the judge overseeing their ongoing divorce case. In the 1964 "Texas Collector" sale the Leadbeater cover sold for \$9,000 to Eugene Costales, acting as agent for Bernard D. Peyton, whose collections were later sold by the Siegel firm and Christie's Robson Lowe under the pseudonym "Isleham."

At the Ameripex sale of the "Isleham" United States collection on May 25, 1986 (Siegel Sale 662, lot 1012), the Leadbeater cover sold for \$70,000 hammer to Stanley J. Richmond. In the January 20, 1988, auction held by Richmond's firm, Daniel F. Kelleher Co., the cover was sold as lot 46 for \$90,000 hammer to Stanley M. Piller, acting as agent for for Dr. Leonard Kapiloff, a Maryland real estate investor (and dentist by training, who performed free dental work at a local clinic).

The cover was offered in the Siegel 1992 Rarities sale (Sale 745, lot 279) and went unsold in the auction, but shortly thereafter was sold privately to an anonymous buyer. It was offered in the Siegel 2000 Rarities (Sale 824, lot 3) and realized \$130,000 hammer, selling to "D.K." for his collection of "Stamps Issued by People." The D.K. collection of U.S. Postmasters' Provisionals, Carriers and Locals, and Southern Postmasters' Provisionals, excluding the Leadbeater cover, was subsequently dispersed in Siegel sales.

Since the last appearance of this cover at auction in 2000, only two Alexandria provisional stamps have been offered, both off cover and sold in Siegel auctions. The Frelinghuysen collection featured the uncancelled Ferrary-Lapham copy, which realized \$550,000 hammer (Mar. 28, 2012, Sale 1020, lot 1). The Siegel 2012 Rarities sale featured the cancelled Worthingon-Caspary-Phillips-Lilly copy, which realized \$290,000 hammer (Sale 1025, lot 8).

The published census compiled by Jerome S. Wagshal (available at our website at http://siegelauctions.com/dynamic/census/5/5.pdf) contains at least 98 unduplicated records of Scott 5. Therefore, the 1c 1851 Type I is the rarest of all United States stamps issued regularly prior to the 1868 Grills. This stamp has not been offered to the market since the consignor purchased it in a Siegel auction in 1969.

However, unlike 7R, small portions of the bottoms were ironed out when the entries were made below them. Positions 6R and 8R had less of the bottom erased than the other Type Ib positions, and for this reason they are more desirable examples of the type. Although Positions 3-6R1E could form a strip of four, no such multiple has been recorded in used condition. Only the original-gum block from Positions 4-9/14-15R1E (Wagshal Census 5-UNC-002) contains a larger number of Type Ib positions than this strip.

The 4c stamp portrays an electric automobile, known at the time as the "Electric Vehicle Service," as depicted on the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad brochure from which the engraving was made. In the background one can see the dome of the Capitol. The two men depicted in the front seat are both chauffeurs. The man in the passenger compartment is Samuel P. Hege, so this stamp actually depicts a living person in violation of the law.

The 4c Pan-American Invert was a special printing and not regularly issued. Examples were distributed through two official channels, and the gum on the majority of stamps without "Specimen" overprint was disturbed. In fact, because the stamps were removed from mounting paper, they are generally thinned or have seriously disturbed gum. Scott Catalogue notes that "Values are for examples with full original gum that is slightly disturbed".





Our recently updated census of Scott 314A incorporates the records of the Philatelic Foundation, the Levi records (which represents over 40 years of auction sales) and our own computerized sales history. 

During the early stages of production of the 1908-09 Washington-Franklin stamps, the Bureau tried to solve the problem of paper shrinkage that caused off-center perforations and resulted in a large number of unusable sheets. Armstrong notes that up to twenty percent of sheets had to be discarded. The first such experiments resulted in the Bluish Paper stamps (Scott 357-366). Rag cloth was added to the wood pulp mixture, but this did not have the desired effect and the experiment was discontinued.

According to Johl (Vol. 1, page 175), the only source of the 4c and 8c Bluish stamps was the archives of the Post Office Department. Approximately 80 of each were traded for rare stamps missing from the archives. Given the failed experimental nature of the paper mixture, it is no surprise that virtually all copies are off-center to some extent.

Our Levi records contain a half-dozen blocks of four (none larger), but several of these may have been broken up — the Levi records on three are from the 1950's and 1960's.





The sheets were then moved to the sheet-fed Giori press which printed the intaglio brown candle holder and lettering. The intaglio plates were numbered 39076, 39086, 39087 and 39088.

As a result of the foldover it is possible to see the distance between the offset plate numbers and the stamp's design (the yellow and orange plate nos. appeared above the brown and so were not captured on this multiple). Offset plate numbers are impossible to find because a large foldover such as the one offered here, which are easier for inspectors to detect, would have to occur in order for it to be captured.

Official records indicate that no impressions were made from 39077 (yellow) and 39079 (brown), and there are no impression data for 39078 (orange). Durland notes that the first day of issue was July 2, 1979, and since all other offset plates for this issue were sent to press after that date, it must be that these three were used to print the initial supply.



The first printing of the 24c 1918 Air Post issue was trimmed so that the plate numbers and arrow were removed, resulting in a straight edge at top and right. After the invert error was discovered on one of the first printed sheets, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing decided to retain the top selvage. It added the word "TOP" to the blue "Jenny" vignette plate, so that when the new sheets were printed the word "TOP" would appear in the newly-retained upper selvage. This would show the pressmen the correct direction of the blue "Jenny" vignette plate, to insure that the invert error would not reoccur. Shortly after the blue "TOP" was added, sheets were printed with the additional red "TOP".

Accompanied by 2009 P.F. certificate stating "Genuine Scott UX10a, the card miscut, with one complete impression inverted, and portions of four cards printed normally." Whether the central impression was the first "normal" impression, which makes more sense to us and matches the Scott Catalogue listing, or the quadruple split was the first "normal" impression and the center was printed inverted as stated on the P.F. certificate, cannot be conclusively proven. However, this is of little consequence. Collectors can display this card in either orientation as it suits their tastes. We have not seen another example of this error and this may well be unique.

STEVEN R. BELASCO'S "HISTORY OF STAMP COLLECTORS AND DEALERS 1859-1899"



The late Steven R. Belasco was well known and celebrated in philatelic circles for his work on private vending and affixing machine perforations. His 2009 book has become the standard reference on the subject, and the Siegel firm dispersed Mr. Belasco's collection of that material in June 2010. Since many private perfs were philatelically inspired, Mr. Belasco naturally segued into collecting covers and ephemera related to the development of stamp collecting and dealing. He continued this collection until his death in May 2012.

The "History of U.S. Stamp Collectors and Dealers 1859-1899" was discussed by Mr. Belasco in a series of Chronicle articles beginning in 2009. He approached the subject through the study of covers, letters, postcards and ephemera from collectors and dealers of the period, and his work culminated in an outstanding exhibit, a scan of which is posted to our website (http://siegelauctions.com/ exhibits/Belasco.pdf). The exhibit documented the development and spread of stamp collectors and dealers, from mainly a few East Coast cities to the rest of the country. It begins in 1859, the year of the earliest reported letter discussing a U.S. stamp collector (see lot 2628). It concludes with the end of the 19th Century, by which time all the key aspects of stamp dealing, collecting, publications and societies were well developed and had spread to nearly every part of the country. The exhibit includes many outstanding covers, the most important of which are offered as individual lots in the following section. In addition, the balance of the exhibit is offered intact (lot 2696) as well as a fascinating large group of early stamp dealer price lists and circulars (lot 2698).

The dispersal of the Belasco collection of the "History of Stamp Collectors and Dealers 1859-1899" will now allow a new group of collectors to add these fascinating postal artifacts to their collections.







BALANCE OF THE BELASCO COLLECTION



U.S. Stamp Dealers and Collectors, 1859-1899, Exhibit Collection. Exhibit pages and related cover collection assembled and annotated by the late Steven R. Belasco, approximately 1,000 covers and pieces of ephemera mounted on more than 150 exhibit pages and in six large binders, many covers valued at \$200 or more have been removed and offered as individual lots, but what remains is an outstanding postal history based study of dealers and collectors for the decades of the 19th Century, plus copious research, notes and illustrations, wide range of stamp issues incl. Hawaii plus some better ephemera such as price lists, six United States Stamp Co. Certificates of Stock with 5c Foreign Exchange Revenue stamps, and Issue #1 of the Stamp Collector's Record, which was the first U.S. stamp periodical (published by S. Allan Taylor), letters discussing stamp collecting from as early as 1868, exhibit is organized by decade and state and then by dealer, the nature of these types of covers means nearly all are at least corner cards and many are richly illustrated, overall nice condition

AN OUTSTANDING AND IMPORTANT POSTAL HISTORY COLLECTION TRACING THE STAMP HOBBY'S EARLY DEALERS AND COLLECTORS.

Mr. Belasco was widely regarded for his work on private vending and affixing machine coils (his book is the definitive reference on the subject). Since many private perfs were philatelically inspired, Mr. Belasco naturally segued into collecting covers and ephemera related to the development of stamp collecting and dealing. During the last years of his life he published a series of articles in the *Chronicle*, which tell the story of the early dealers and collectors through the covers they mailed................(Photo Ex) E. 10,000-15,000



The Type II imperforate Shield issue is only known in the Lake and Carmine colors. The Lake color exists fully imperforate. The Carmine color is only known with Schermack Type III perforations. We have been fascinated by this listing for some time, and undertook a census. For used examples, we record two singles. Since publishing our census, perhaps three more, including two other covers, have come to light.



This pane is printed in the distinctive Deep Milky Blue shade on very thin, nearly transparent paper. Prior to the discovery of this pane, only a few examples of Scott 117L7 were known. The Philatelic Foundation has certified this as "onion-skin paper" (an unlisted variety of 117L7), but in our opinion there is no such thing as a Pomeroy stamp on "onion skin paper," and this paper matches the other known examples of Scott 117L7, so we are not really sure why the P.F. felt compelled to create a new unlisted paper variety to describe this pane.

According to *British Pictorial Envelopes of the 19th Century*, "Free frank privileges for members of the Houses of Parliament ceased with the introduction of Uniform Penny Postage on the 10th of January. After consultation, Rowland Hill arranged for plain printed envelopes to be supplied, probably free, to members of both houses in their stationery racks. When posted in the official boxes in Parliament they would incur no postal charges. The covers which bore the note "Temporary" ceased to be available from the 5th of May 1840."

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

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
