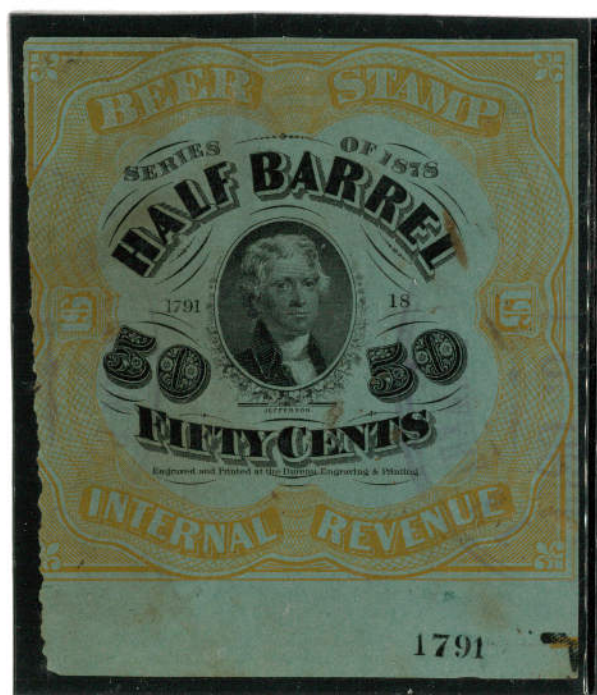
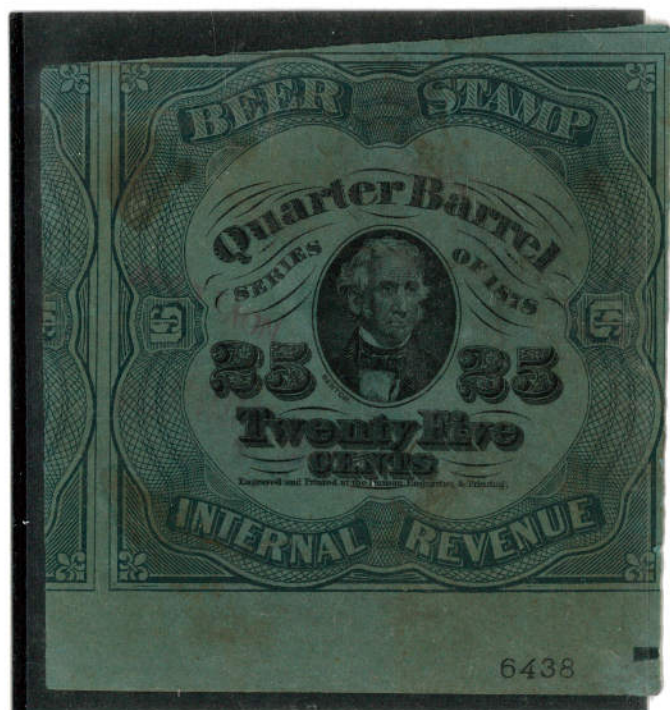
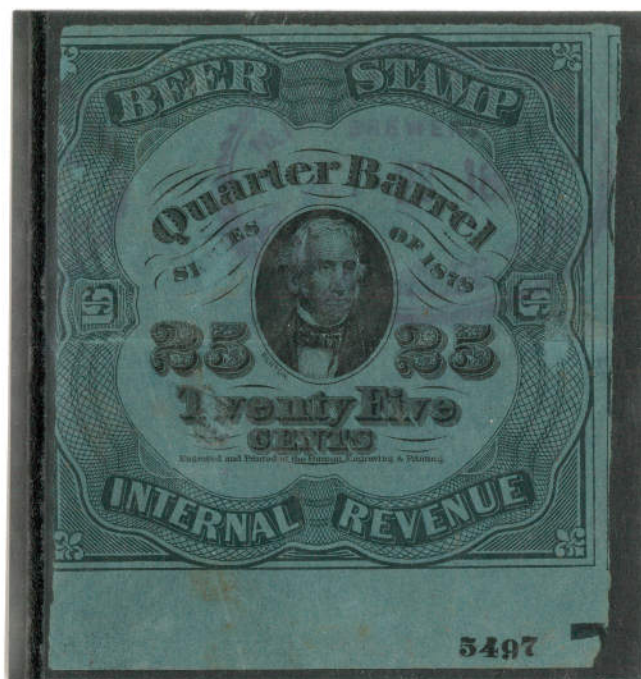
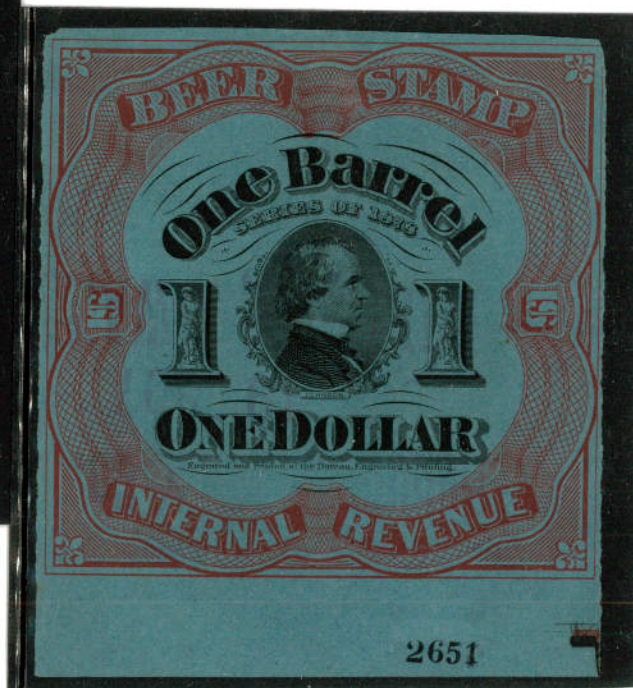
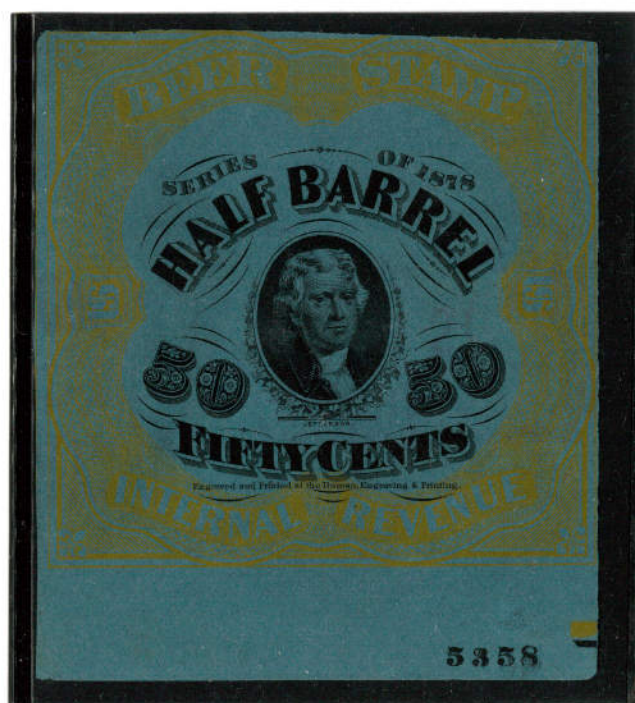
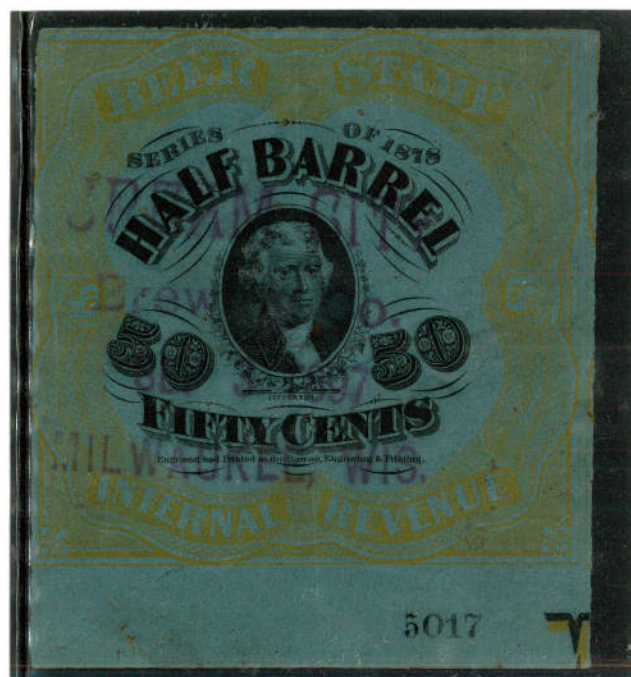
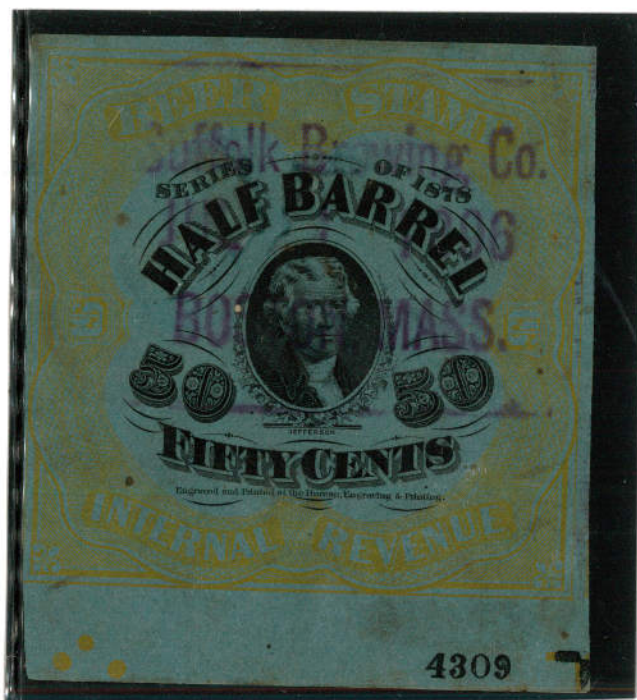


The Bureau later gave up the idea of vignette plate and position numbers on each stamp, and placed the vignette plate number in the bottom margin under stamp 18. Plate 1791 is an interesting case, since the plate number is in both places. The next several pages show vignette plate numbers in the bottom margin.



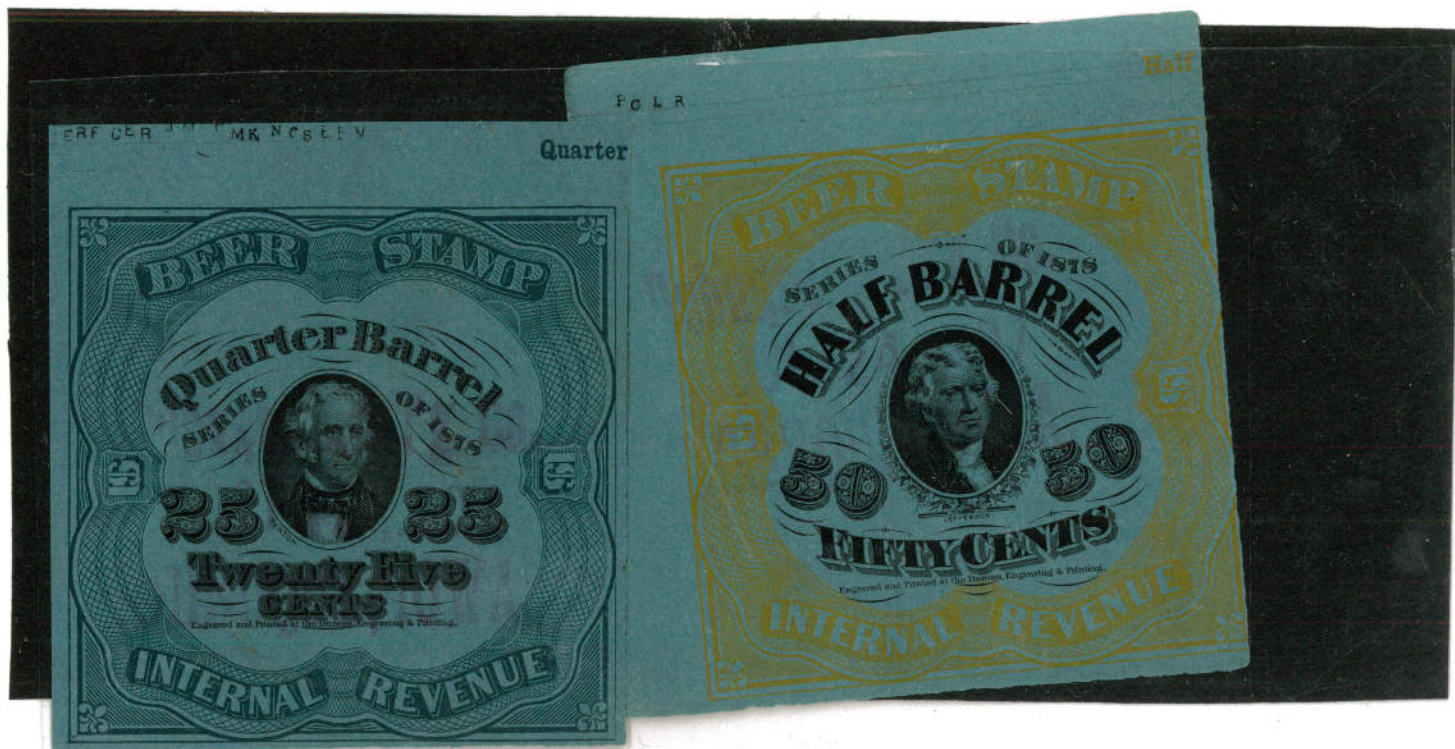

Note the stamp with plate number 2651; apparently the plate and position numbers were removed from the vignette images of this plate (compare the example on page 8). The bottom plate number may have been present in the earlier state of the plate.

 "1" in bottom margin to identify frame plate as one barrel.

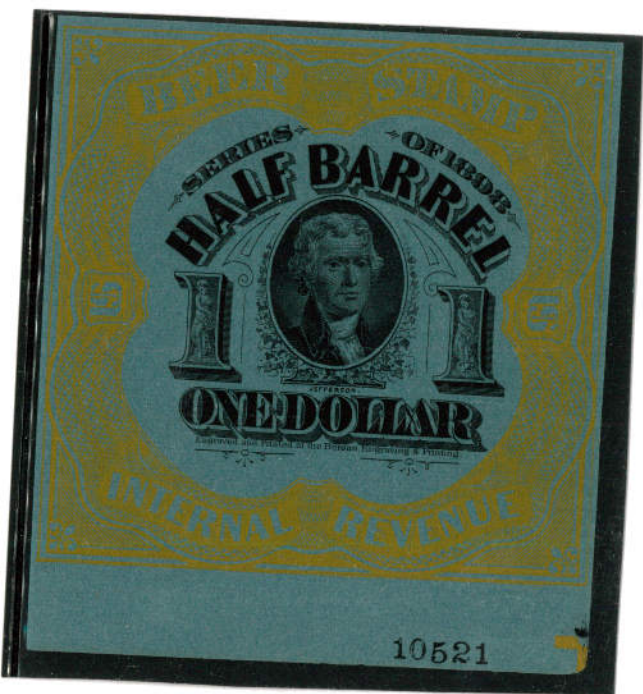


Series 1878 stamps overprinted in 1898 to double the value.





Series 1898 stamps with vignette plate number in bottom margin.

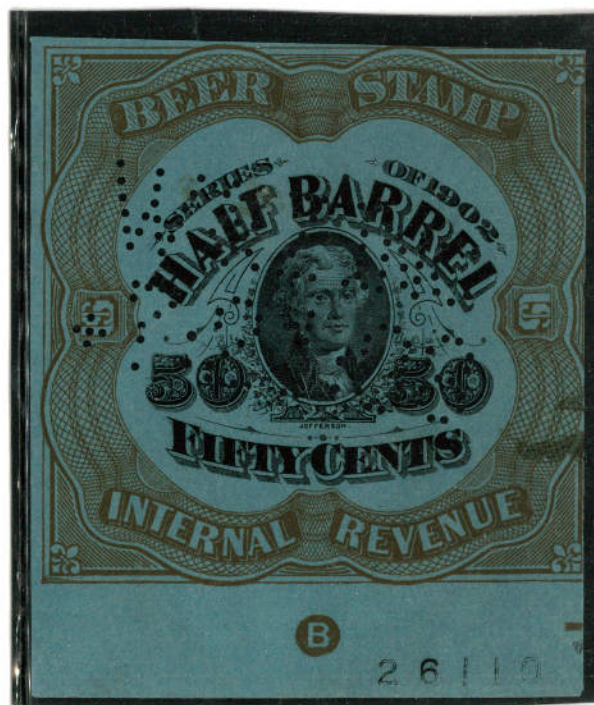
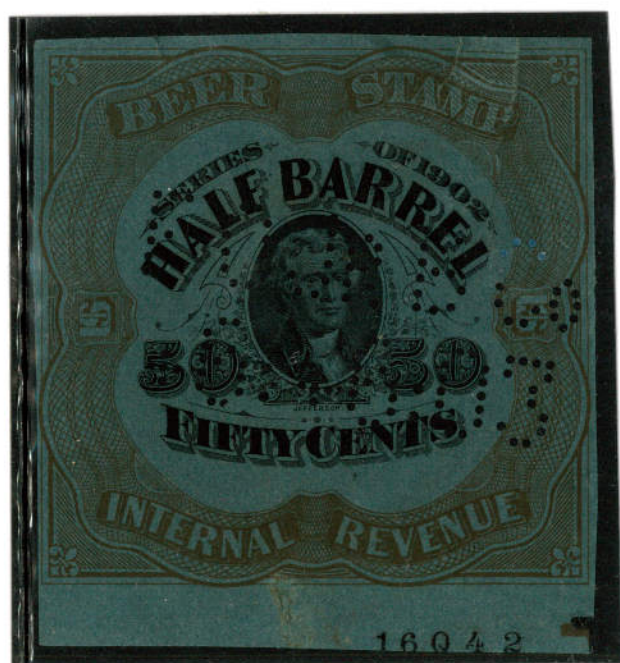
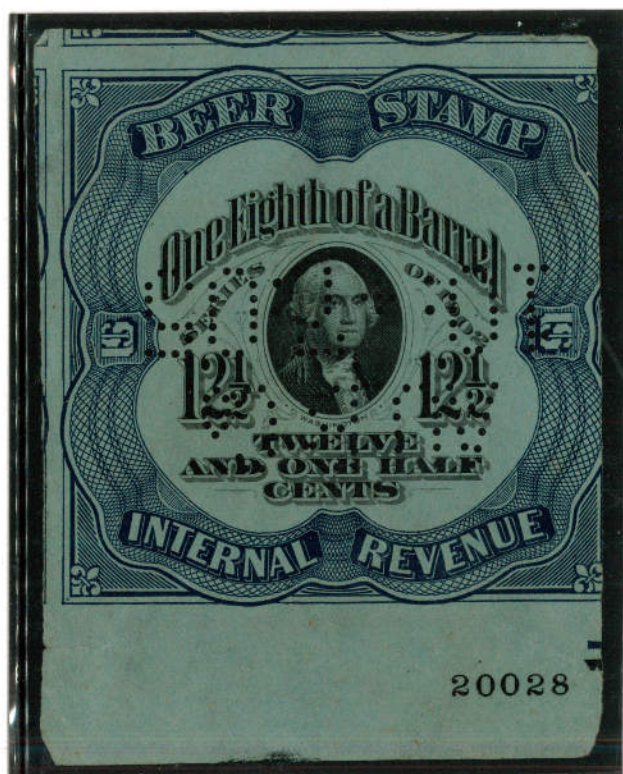


Series 1901 stamps with vignette plate number in bottom margin.
