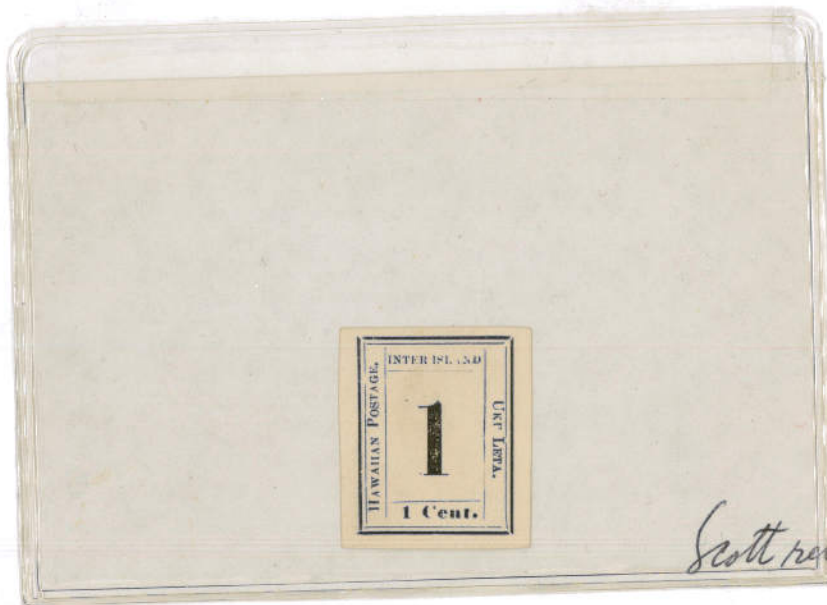

Kalakaua I was doubly tied to the Iolani Palace postal card because the Iolani Palace was built for him in 1882 and he helped design it. The Renaissance-style mansion served as a royal residence until Queen Liliuokalani was overthrown in 1893. After Hawaii became a territory of the United States, the building was used as the capitol building. Today it represents the only royal palace in the United States.

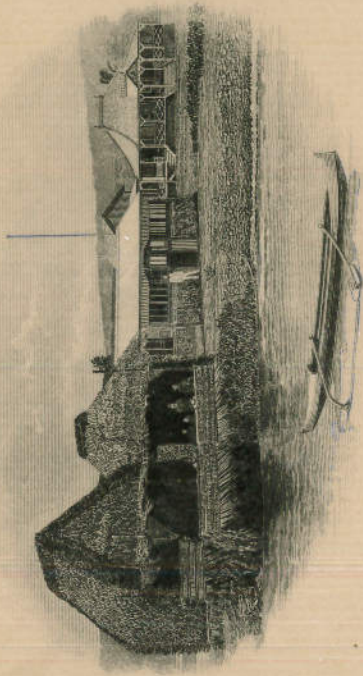
