

# A Wilson Roulette

(A Private Perforation of 1929)



This philatelic variety was created in October, 1929, when a large accumulation of mint imperforate sheets, left with a Pittsburgh bank, were taken up by the bank on an unpaid loan. In order to get their value, they were privately roulette for postage use, and after a portion of the lot were thus used, they came to philatelic attention.

The greater portion were lost to philately when used on non-philatelic mail, and it was only through the good fortune of their being noticed by Eli T. Parker, a stamp dealer of Bethlehem, Penna., that they are today known.

These stamps are genuine when bearing the roulette perforations characteristic of these stamps, and when each individual stamp is signed in pencil on the back, thus:
