With reference to our respects of 23rd ulto, duplicate en-
closed, we have the pleasure to advise that on the arrival of the
"Richmond" we managed to give her a cargo for your port at $\$8$
and ship by her part of the sugar we intended for "Revere" the
Capt of latter vessel consenting to receive 400 tons sugar in all,
we were able to send you 200 tons, and have you enclosed
Invoice no 2963 of 400 pounds to your address, amounting to the
sum of $\$24,559$. balanced by negotiation of bill on Mess Baring
for £ 5000. at $4\frac{1}{2}\%$. and others on your good account for $\$581.58$ as
per account Current herewith. The uncertainty as to rate for storing
has obliged us to draw on you for a small amount, and the
higher rate in London than last quotations brings us up to a very
close point under your limit. Even at $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ rates of storing are
but moderate and tendency against sellers. Some sugar has
been sold from second hands at $\$5\frac{7}{8}$ and dealers ask this for
Current cleared from new crop in March. Dump announcing and
 $\$4\frac{1}{4}$ @ $4\frac{5}{16}$. should be quoted today, white higher has been paid
for some parcels to arrive. Orders from G. Britain permit higher
prices to be paid than hitherto from U. States, and shipments to
