



On July 1, 1870, the rate to the United States became six cents. Here, the two cent stamp is bisected to create a one cent stamp for use with a five cent stamp to cover the new rate, as six cent stamps were not available at the time of the change. (MH at page 190)






The full rate from Hawaii to the U. S. was 6 cents in 1876.
Hand stamp to that effect applied in Hawaii. (MH 233.24,
with picture at page 88.)

Cancel is MH No. 116. However, MH indicates that the 116
first used in 1877, but the hand stamp shows was mailed in
1876 when the 115 was in use. The 115 punched holes in the
envelope and letter. It was later modified to print three small
circles as done here, MH indicating the change was in 1877. Note
diameter of this cancel is 22 mm., but MH indicates cancel was
21 mm.









