Letters mailed late or handed to a ship's captain or purser at shipside or aboard ship provide interesting studies... "Paquebot" markings came into use in 1894 (after informal discussion at the 1892 UPU Conference) and were applied to letters in the ship's letter bag once the bag was turned in at the destination post office. Late letters typically bear a postmark from Honolulu but letters in the other categories do not. San Francisco used one of several kinds of cancelling devices on loose letters and paquebot letters. 







Official Stamps

1896

Used for official correspondence by all government departments, and by the militia, even though inscribed "Dept. Of Foreign Affairs". They were also sold to collectors. Later, to prevent unauthorized usage, they were cancelled before sale. The postally used stamps have a higher value. All portray Lorrin Andrews Thurston.


