

POSTAGE OF HAWAII

Hawaii, an independent kingdom, became a republic in 1893. In 1898 Hawaii was annexed to the United States at the request of the inhabitants. Statehood for Hawaii occurred in 1959 to become the 50th. State of the Union.

The first issues of Hawaiian stamps appeared in 1851 and remained in use through June 13, 1900.

This collection consists of Hawaiian stamps issued during the period prior to the replacement of stamps by the United States government on June 14, 1900.
