


Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to New York City, New York dated 5/13/45. It bears a red Philadelphia F-33 forwarding handstamp and an octagonal cut 75L5 that is canceled with a manuscript "R".



Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to New York City dated 6/3/45. This letter bears a red F-33 forwarding handstamp and a 75L5 with a "R" cancel. It also bears a manuscript "Single" notation.



Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to New York City dated 11/19/44. This letter bears a red F-33 forwarding handstamp and a 75L5 with a "P" manuscript cancel. This is the earliest known use of the "P" cancel that appears on seven letters. It was in use until 2/12/45.



Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to New York City dated 12/13/44. This letter bears a red F-33 forwarding handstamp and a 75L1 canceled with a black manuscript "P". There is also a pencil notation "2 cents" indicating that local delivery in New York had been paid. There is also an indistinct black manuscript notation in the lower left corner.



Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to New York City dated 12/17/44. This letter bears a red F-33 forwarding handstamp and a red C-3 collect handstamp that has been crossed out. It bears a 75L1 and a manuscript "2 cents" notation indicating local delivery in New York had been paid.



Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to Providence, Rhode Island dated 2/12/45. This letter bears a red F-33 forwarding handstamp and a 75L5 with a "P" manuscript cancel. This is the latest known date for use of the "P" cancel.
