Whereas William Wing, of Gallatin county, Illinois,
has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Shawneetown,
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Wing,
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled, "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the In-Lots numbered six hundred and eighty-nine and six hundred and ninety, in Shawneetown, in the district of lands
subject to sale at Shawneetown, Illinois,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been
purchased by the said William Wing.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress, in such case made and provided,
Have given and granted, and by these Presents Do give and grant, unto the said William Wing,
and to his heirs, the said tract above described, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of
whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William Wing,
and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I, Andrew Jackson,
PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made PATENT, and the SEAL of the GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be
hereunto affixed.

One thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, and of the Independence of the United States the fifty-sixth.

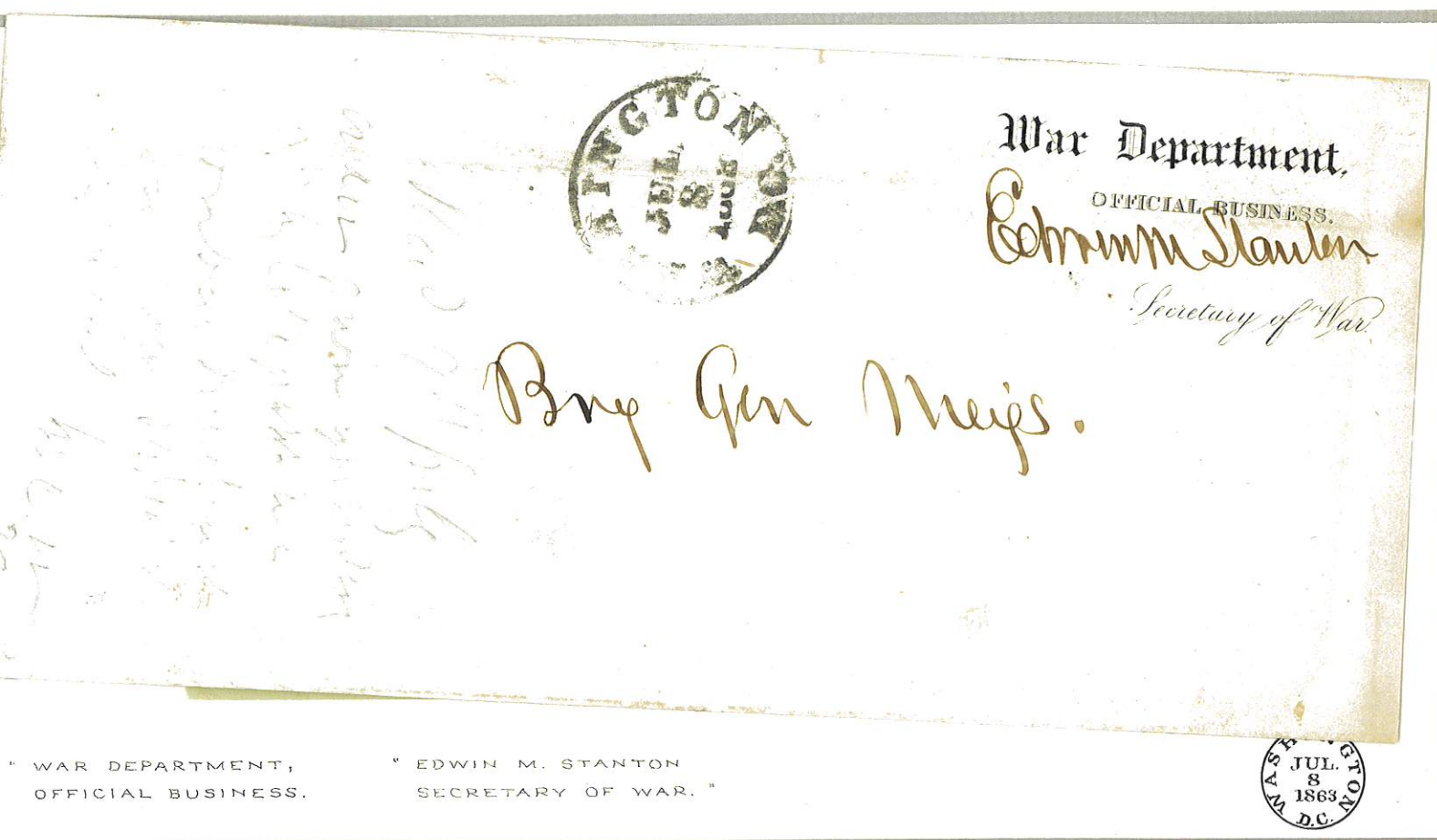

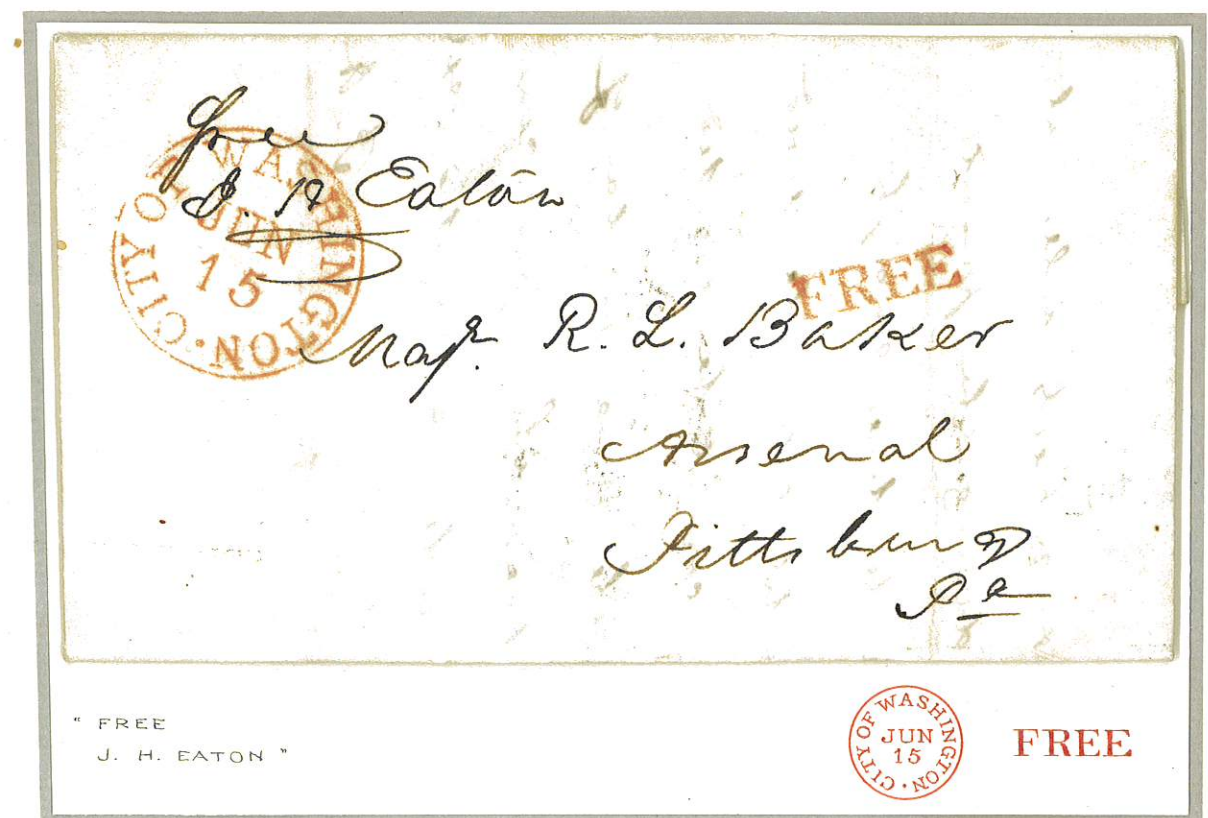

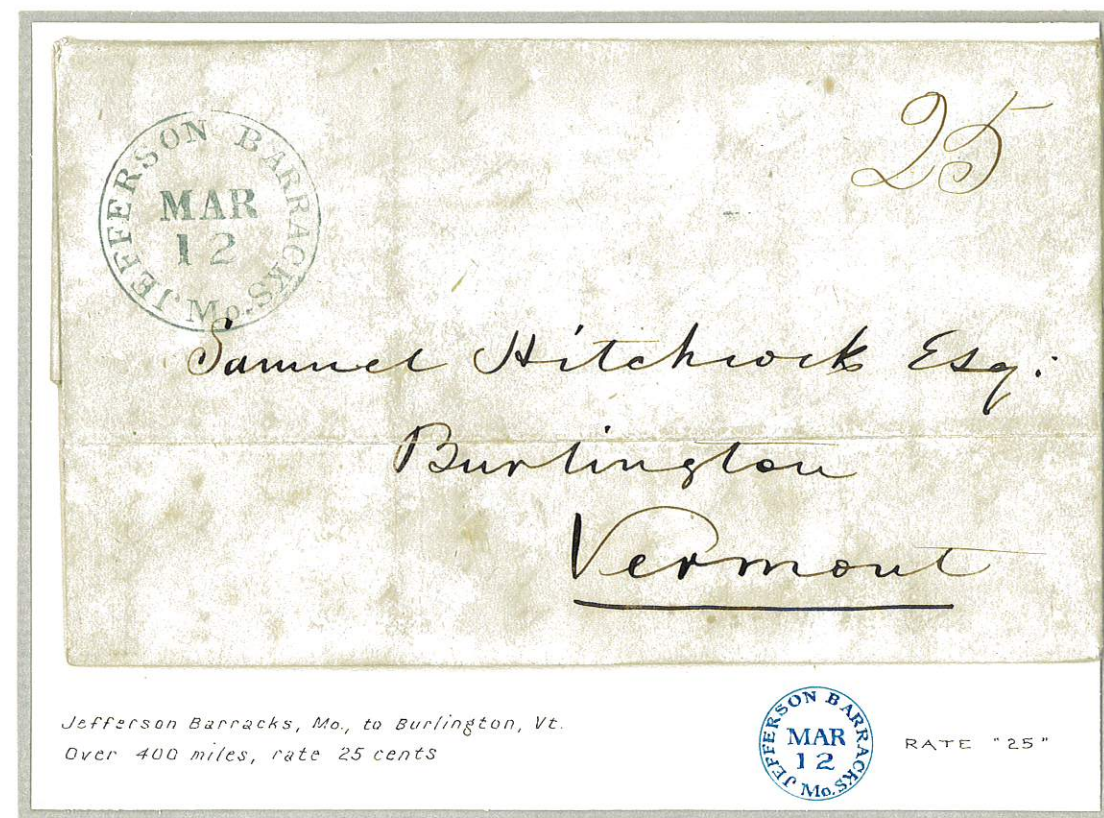
