Issued on 21 January 1919, a limited quantity of the offset printed one cent imperforate was issued for the use of the Schermack Company.



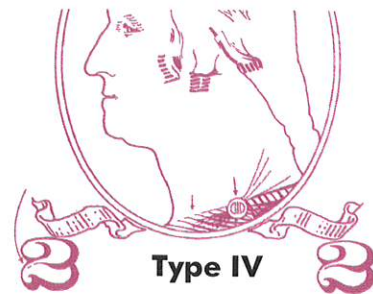

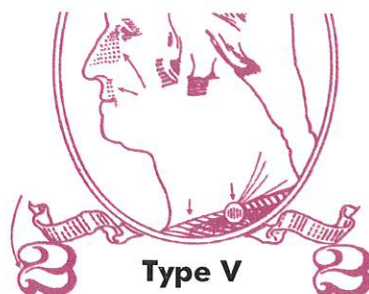
TWO CENTS  
TYPES IV TO VII

First issued on 25 April 1920, the offset printed imperforate two cents were produced from all five die types used for the perforated stamps. The type VII (Scott #534B) is the rarity of the group.



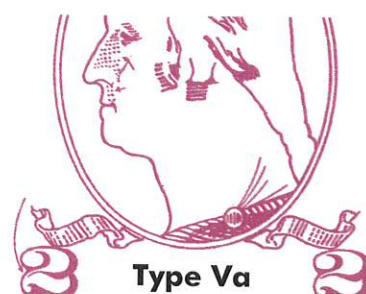
Type IV

Top line of toga is broken. Outer lines in button are curved to form "DID" but with first "D" reversed. Line through left "2" is very thin and usually broken.



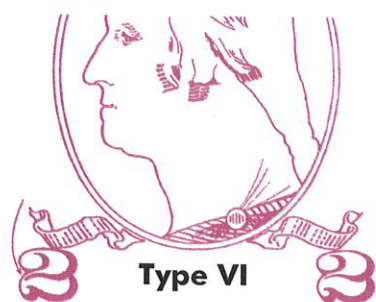
Type V

Top line of toga is complete. Five vertical shading lines in toga button. Two vertical columns of shading dots below nose.



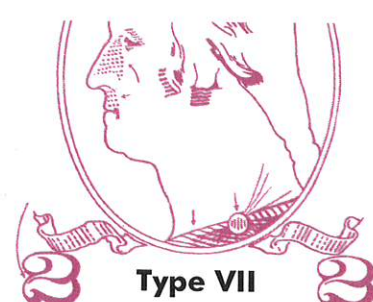
Type Va

As type V except change in the nose shading dots. Nose shading changed, third row of dots from the bottom now has four dots instead of six dots.



Type VI

Generally as type V except that the line of color in the left "2" is very heavy.



Type VII

An extra column of dots has been added to the upper lip. There are now 4 rows of 3 dots each (type V has only 2 dots in each column)

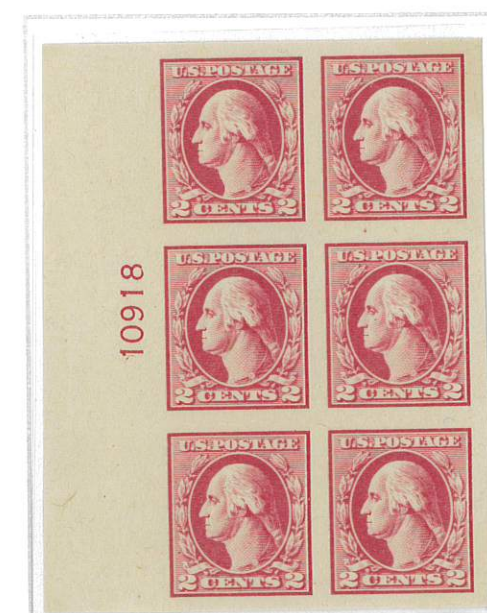

The offset plates used to print the two cents stamps varied in size. The type IV prints, from plates numbered between 10818 and 10935 were all 400 subject plates. The first type IV plate was certified for use on 6 March 1920. (Scott #532)

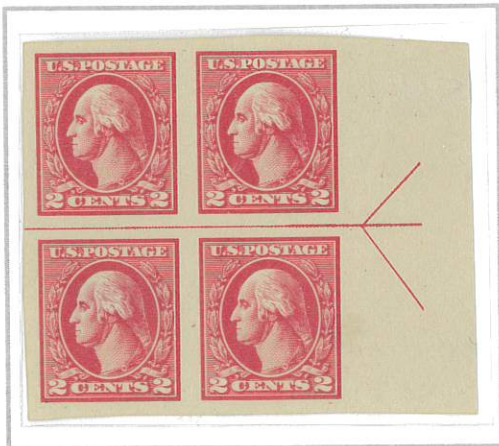

The offset plates used to print the two cents stamps varied in size. The type Va prints used plates of 400 and 1600 subjects. The first type Va plate was certified for use on 25 May 1920. The set of plate number 12002 blocks shown below were printed from a 400 subject plate. (Scott #534)



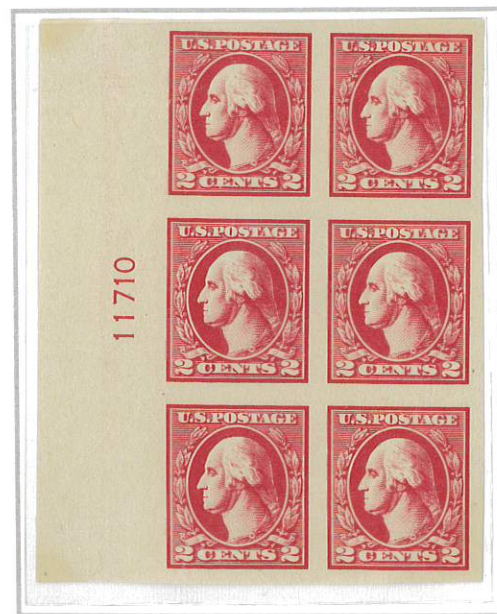

TWO CENTS, TYPE VI  
PLATE BLOCKS

The type VI prints, from plates numbered between 11562 and 11820 were 400, 800 or 1600 subject plates. The first type VI plate was certified for use on 26 July 1920. The set of plate number 11710 blocks shown below were printed from a 1,600 subject plate. (Scott #534A)

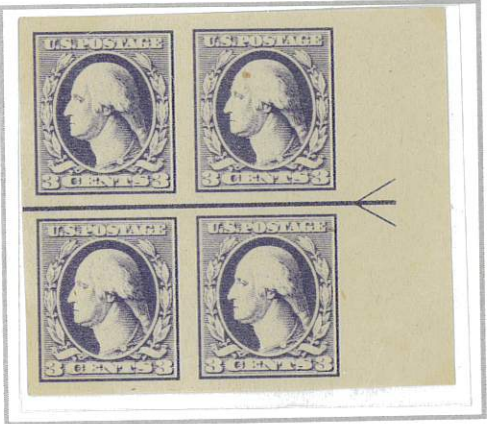
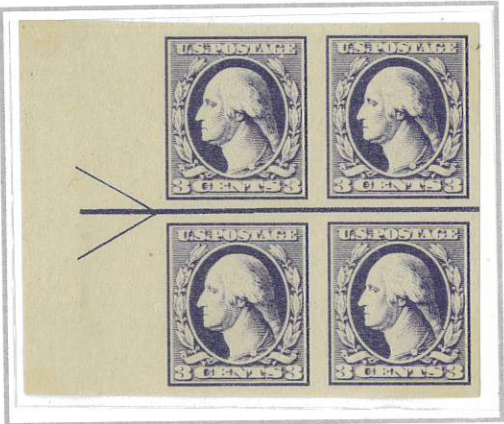
Issued on 5 October 1918, the imperforate three cents was offset printed from a type IV plate. It was made especially for Mail-O-Meter Company which was using the Schermack slot perforations at the time. (Scott #535)
