In the early days of the postal service, not only was a great deal of mail sent without sufficient postage, but also post offices had a "hit or miss" system of collecting the postage due. Starting in 1879, and continuing today, the Post Office Department issued "Postage Due" stamps indicating to the recipients the exact amount of money due. This system has always worked efficiently both from the collection and book-keeping angles.
