





German Ostasiatische Expedition Force in China 1901. Field Post Card from the III Seebataillon Railroad Engineer company sent from Fang Tsun to Berlin. Despatch 11 March 1901. Arrive Berlin XX, April, 1901. Boxed cachet "S.B. Ostas. Exped. Eisenb. Baukomp."


Message reads: "I received your kind postcard dated 18 January today. Thank you so much. Everything else is OK and we are feeling well, but the beer is miserable."





Japanese I.J.P.O. Tientsin 1900




Japanese domestic 4 Sen postcard used from the I.J.P.O in Tientsin to Germany. Despatch 3 October 1900, arrival Erfurt 16 November 1900. Transit Yokohama 15 October 1900. Writer notes that he is 2km from Taku Forts where fierce action took place in June and July 1900.

German Schiffspost Port Arthur




Japanese card used from the Marine Schiffspost No. 44 on board S.M.S. 'Tiger' at Port Arthur. Dated 2 June 1913 in the inter-war years. Card shows view of 'Show House' at Port Arthur.



German offices in Tientsin

American presence in China 1913. General Mark Clark



Cover from Tientsin to America via Siberia. Sent 21 October 1913 from German Post Office in Tientsin by Major C.C. Clark, 15th US Infantry. Letter addressed to Major Clark's son, Cadet Mark Wayne Clark at West Point Military Academy. Mark Clark graduated in 1917 and served in France in 1918 where he was wounded in action in the Vosges mountain sector. In May 1942 he became a Major-General and Chief of Staff Army Ground Forces. General Eisenhower selected Clark to plan the invasion of North Africa (Operation Torch) in November 1942, and led the 5th Army invasion of Italy, driving all the way to Rome.

Simple cover, interesting connections.
