

# Trans-Atlantic Air mail

Pan American Miami to Capetown and back 1941/2.



Route: Miami-Leopoldville-Capetown-Leopoldville-New York. Despatch Miami 6 December 1941, transit Leopoldville 12 December, Capetown 5/8 January 1942, New York 16 February 1942.

Rate: Originally 80c., 5Fr. added Leopoldville, 5/- added at Capetown.

Censor: Re-sealing label South Africa.

Features: Amazing! Cover sent on first Miami-Leopoldville flight originally addressed to Postmaster Capetown (under lower address label). Someone in Leopoldville added 5Fr. cancelled 12/12/41 and forwarded to Capetown, probably by Sabena. Capetown affixed 5/- paid for by enclosed "coupons", presumably IRCs, and sent letter back to New York, but not as addressed as "trans-Pacific" because of Pearl Harbour but back via West Africa, probably by one of the Pan American "Special Mission" flights. See original letter from Postmaster Capetown.
