Stitch Watermark. A type of watermark consisting of a row of short parallel lines. This is caused by the stitches, which join the ends of the band on which the paper pulp is first formed. "Stitch watermarks" have been found on a great many issues and may exist on all.

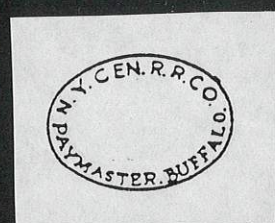

"JOS. R. CARPENTER, Philadelphia***We prefer the ordinary proprietary stamp to going to the expense of a private die, if we can obtain one of a 6c. denomination. It seems very extraordinary to us that such parsimony should exist with the Gov't. in so small a matter. To require the use of a 6c. stamp for a \$1.50 preparation (and there are more than a hundred of them), and then refuse to provide the stamp requisite, is what could hardly have been expected. If such a tax is to be exacted it surely belongs to the Gov't. to provide the stamp."

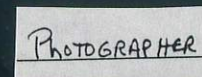
