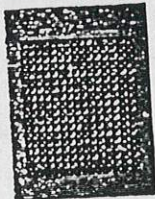

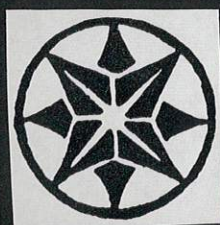

First printed in lake, the 2c Washington Stamp (Scott No. 220) was criticized for its color. So the stamp was re-issued in carmine, and some interesting varieties occurred.

On the Scott No. 220a, a "cap" is seen on the left numeral "2" — where ink failed to transfer to the stamp. On Scott No. 220c, "caps" are seen on both left and right numerals. These varieties, very popular and well-known among collectors, are commonly called the "Cap varieties".



"Broken Hat" Variety

Type I (Triangle I). The horizontal lines of the ground work run across the triangle and are of the same thickness within it as without.

Type II (Triangle II). The horizontal lines cross the triangle but are thinner within it than without.



Type III (Triangle III). The horizontal lines do not cross the double lines of the triangle. The lines within the triangle are thin, as in Type II. Two varieties of Type III are known, but the variations are minor.



A97 Type I The circles enclosing "S1" are broken where they meet the curved line below. One Dollar



A97 Type II The circles are complete.





Type I. The tips of the foliate ornaments do not impinge on the white curved line below "ten cents."



Type II. The tips of the ornaments break the curved line below the "e" of "ten" and the "t" of "cents".

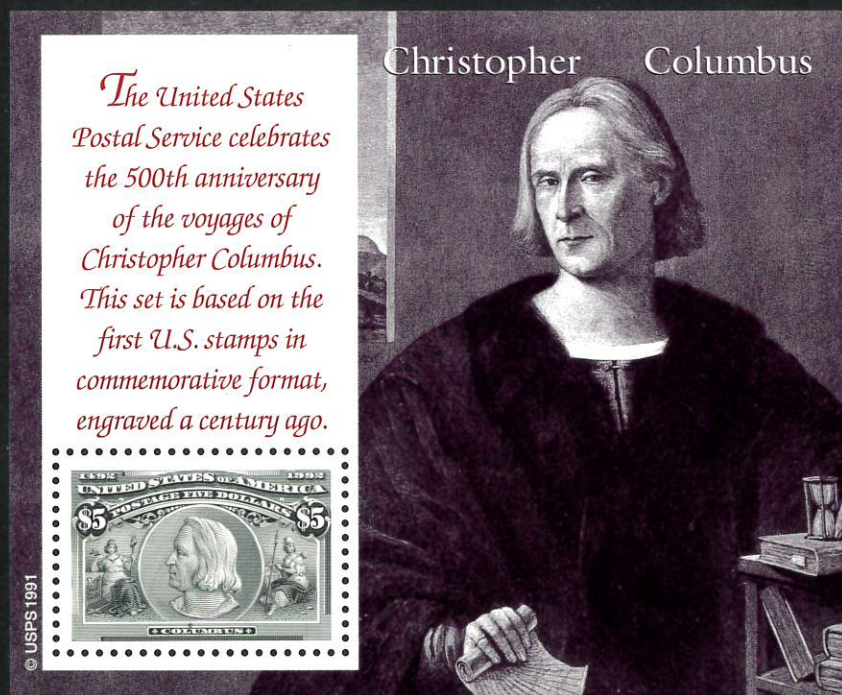
