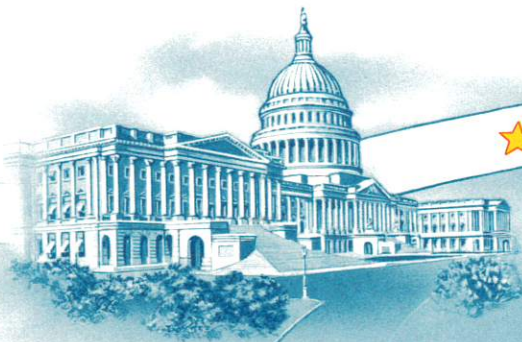


Sloop Restaurationen

1926



Liberty Bell

A two cent stamp featuring the Liberty Bell and issued for the 150th anniversary of American Independence celebrated at the Sesquicentennial Exposition at Philadelphia, 1926.



Statue of John Ericsson

Memorializing John Ericsson, builder of the Monitor, this 5¢ stamp was issued on the unveiling of his statue by the Crown Prince of Sweden at Washington, D. C., in 1926.

Surrender of Burgoyne

The surrender of Burgoyne at Saratoga marked the end of a campaign in which the Battles of Fort Stanwix, Oriskany, Bennington, and Saratoga played an important part. The stamp marks the 150th anniversary of the campaigns end.

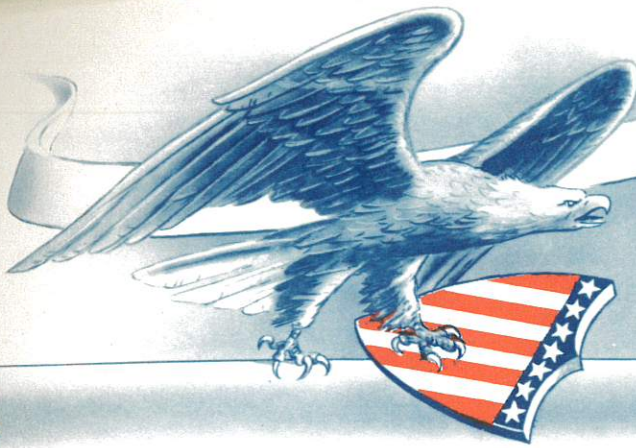
VALLEY FORGE ISSUE

1929



Surrender of Fort Sackville

A painting by Frederick C. Yohn showing the surrender of Fort Sackville near Vincennes, Ind., adorns the bicolor stamp honoring George Rogers Clark issued in 1929.

This exploit by Colonel George Rogers Clark at Fort Sackville, over the British was responsible for bringing the Northwest Territory into the Union.



MASSACHUSETTS BAY

1930



Colony Seal

Commemorating the 300th anniversary of the founding of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, this 2¢ stamp carrying the seal of the colony was placed on sale April 8, 1930.

CHARLESTON

1930



Colonial Governor and Indian

Issued to commemorate the 260th anniversary of the founding of the Province of Carolina, as well as the 250th anniversary of Charleston, S. C.

BATTLE OF BRADDOCK

1930



Statue of Col. Washington

The Battle of Braddock stamp honors the 175th anniversary of this historical struggle in American History. First placed on sale July 9, 1930.

BATTLE OF YORKTOWN

1931



Rochambeau, Washington, De Grasse

This stamp, printed in red and black, commemorates the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown, marking the successful conclusion of the American Revolution.

Appearing with General George Washington on the stamp are Count de Rochambeau and Admiral de Grasse who materially aided to defeat the British at Yorktown.

GENERAL VON STEUBEN

1930



General Von Steuben

Issued to honor his exceptional services in drilling and organizing the army in the Colonial cause during the Revolutionary War and for the 200th anniversary of his birth.

GENERAL PULASKI

1931



General Pulaski

General Casimir Pulaski, Polish patriot and hero of the American Revolution, received recognition by the issuance of this stamp on the 150th anniversary of his death.

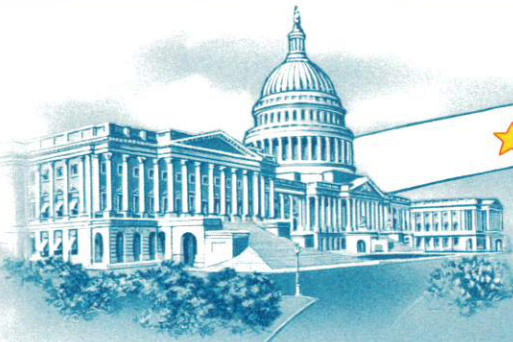
RED CROSS

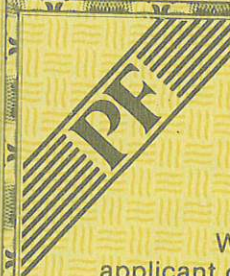
