







Designated First Day use of the 5¢ Stamp, Five known

The original DFD use of the 5¢ stamp was April 26, 1907 along with the 1¢ & 2¢ stamps. As production of the 5¢ stamp started late, the new introduction date was May 10 at the Exposition Station. Five 5¢ DFD covers, are known, all postmarked from the Exposition Station:
Predates known: 5¢ May 8, (Washington, D.C.), and May 9, (Richmond, VA).



Of the nine known examples of this registry postmark, three are dated May 10, 1907, the earliest known use.




Great White Fleet

Originally known as "The Jamestown Tercentennial and Naval and Marine Exhibition," the exposition held at Hampton Roads, the Atlantic naval complex, featured a display of the U. S. naval might. The American squadron consisted of 13 battleships, the strongest U.S. fleet ever assembled. The ships hulls had all been painted white, and ornamented with fancy crests on the bows, with contrasting buff upper-works. At the close of the Exposition, seven additional battleships joined to comprise the "Great White Fleet," which with 12,000 seamen and officers, left Hampton Roads on Dec. 16, for a cruise around the world.


