United States: 1893 (June 2) Registered 2¢ Washington envelope (Scott #U311) uprated with Small Banknote 8¢ Sherman (Scott #225) tied by 'Grand Rapids Mich. Registered' postmark in purple. \$125

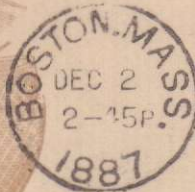
The 8¢ is an important stamp. The Small Banknote series is generally thought of as issued in 1890, but the 8¢ value was not issued until March 21, 1893 in response to reduction in the Registry charge from 10¢ to 8¢. Earliest recorded usage of the stamp is May 4, 1893, after the 8¢ Columbian (Scott #236), which is far more common on cover. It is possible that the 8¢ Sherman may not even exist as a single-franking.

United States: 1887 (Dec. 2) Plimpton/Morgan 2¢ Washington envelope (Scott #U311) with Wigwam Slippers advertisement in yellow, canceled by 'Boston, Mass.' duplex. Sent to Vermont with 'Newbury' octagonal arrival bkstp (Dec. 3). \$90

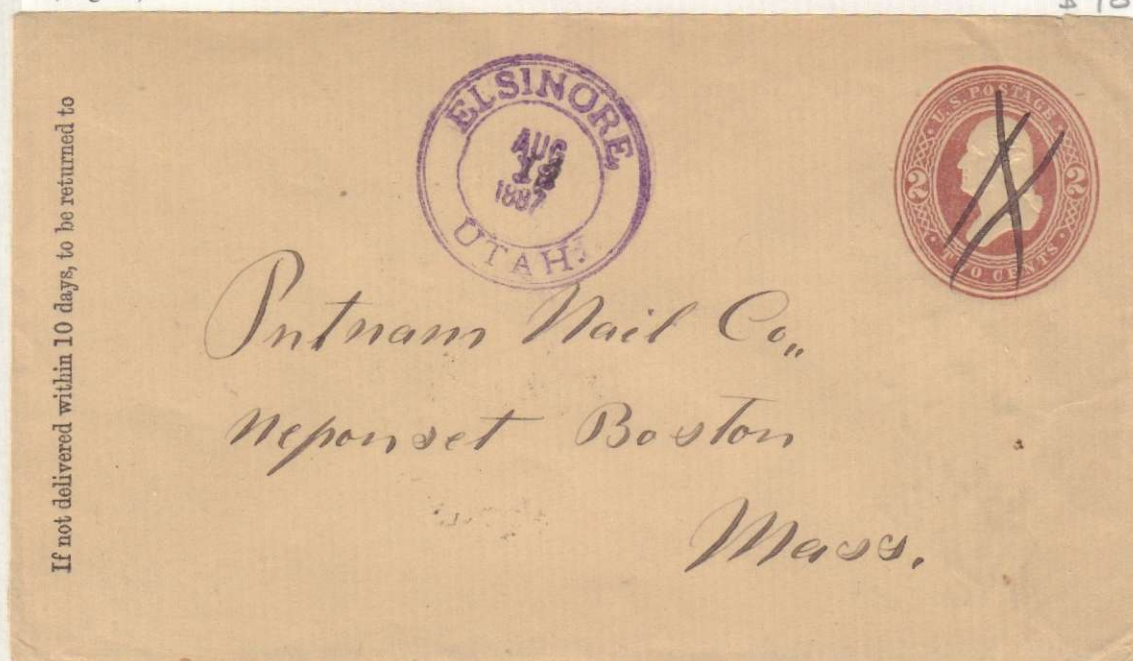

United States: 1886 (Jan. 23) Plimpton/Morgan 2¢ Washington (Scott #U277) with overall **Printed Advertisement** in gray, additionally franked with 2¢ Washington (Scott #210) tied by 'Sacramento Cal' postmark with segmented cork alongside. 'Ogden & San. Fran. R.P.O.' bkstp. \$150



United States: 1887 (Aug. 12) Plimpton/Morgan 2¢ Washington envelope (Scott #U279) from **Utah Territory** to Massachusetts, canceled by ink strokes with purple 'Elsinore Utah' postmark alongside. 'Dorchester' arrival bkstp (Aug. 22). \$90



United States: 1890 (June 13) 2¢ Washington envelope (Scott #U311) uprated with 3¢ Vermilion (Scott #214) tied by 'Boston, Mass.' duplex. Sent to England with two 'London' arrival bkstps (June 24). Stamp with some perf toning, but scarce on cover. \$60



United States: 1866 (ca.) Nesbitt 3¢ Claret Envelope (Scott #U58var) used within Herkimer County, New York, design indicia canceled by two penstrokes with 'Newville NY Apr. 28' written alongside, both in Purple. Sent to Herkimer, eight miles away. \$390

Newville's post office opened in 1825, but no manuscript postmark is recorded in the 1984 'Manuscript Post Offices of New York State' by Chlanda and Wilcox. Possibly the earliest extant example.
