- 5- Mailed at St. Thomas, D.W.I. Feb.

Sender evidently used Patriotic Envelope starting the cruise.

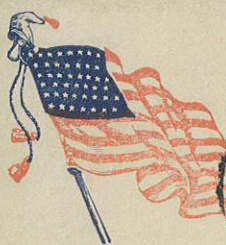
