#### Central Cuban Relief Committee, 58 William Street, N. Y. City.

April 19th, 1898.

Dear Friend:—You have doubtless seen by the press despatches that this Committee will immediately send a special steamer to Cuba, with supplies for the sufferers there. She will carry 1,000 tons or more, which we now have on head. We shall follow her within three weeks, we hope, by another with as much as we can collect in that time.

The despatching of these special steamers with relief supplies is the outcome of a conference between the Department of State and this Committee, in Obedience to the expressed wish of the President. The vessels will be American and will sail from New York to Key West, where they will get orders to proceed. They will carry the United States and Red Cross flags, and be turned over to the American National Red Cross upon leaving New York. In case of hostilities, they will be conveyed to Cuban ports by United States war vessels, and the distribution of supplies will be under an escort of the United States Army. The terms of the Geneva Treaty (Red Cross Treaty) require the Government to furnish such convoy and the Geneva Treaty (Red Cross Treaty) require the Government to furnish such convoy and escort, and the Red Cross flag when thus accompanied will render the supplies and persons distributing the same, neutral, and as such they will be respected and unmolested by the Spanish Army and Navy.

To the end that we may be able to make the second ship load a large and valuable one, will you please immediately resume your efforts in the solicitation of donations? Money remittances should be made to Hon. Chas. A. Schieren, Treasurer, 58 William St., New York, and supplies should be consigned to this Committee at New York, and notice given to the Committee before forwarding. Bill of lading should be mailed us promptly upon shipment. Very truly yours.
